Thank you for your assistance. In a moment, I am going to ask you to listen to a short audio-recording of a student. I am not going to tell you the topic about which the student is speaking. After you have listened to the recording, I will ask you to rate this student's speech intelligibility on a scale of 1 to 5. In other words, I am asking you to tell me how well you understood the student. On this scale, a rating of "1" indicates you did not understand anything the student said. A rating of "5" indicates you understood everything the student said. I may ask you for a little more information about how easy or difficult it was to understand this student.

1. How well did you understand what this student said on a scale of 1 = I understood nothing (0%) to 5 = I understood everything (100%). On this scale, a rating of 3 = I understood about half of what I heard. Please circle your answer.
